- Respect the time, experiences, ideas, feelings, and expertise that are contributed
- Communicate openly, clearly, and timely with the group
- Protect the personal data of group members
- Keep the personal information of members confidential
- Acknowledge PPI contributions in all research outputs
- Facilitate all members of the group to contribute as fully as they would like
- Provide timely compensation in line with up-to-date guidance (currently £25 per hour and travel and subsistence expenses)
- Inform the group of other opportunities to have greater involvement in this research
